THE WAY WE ATE, 100 Chefs Celebrate a Century at the American Table, by Noah Fecks and Paul Wagtouicz, Touchstone/Simon & Schuster, \$35, an extravagantly illlustrated cookbook chronicling the rich culinary history of the last American century. THE ENGLISH COUNTRY HOUSE by James Peill, Vendome, \$55, stately, grand, and a testament to the generations who have cared for them, the 10 English country houses featured in this volume are architecturally distinctive and filled with evocative family memorabilia, from commissioned portraits to monogrammed heirloom dinner services to the bells that once summoned the downstairs staff. Like Downton Abbey, these homes are still in the hands of descendants of the original owners.
